ENGLISH PLACEMENT TESTS AT SCHOOL OF FOREIGN LANGUAGES

- 1. In the school, English placement tests can be administered in two ways:
 - Oxford Online Placement Test,
 - Placement test prepared by the school and conducted face-to-face.
- 2. Which exam will be held in the relevant academic year is announced in the "Announcements" section of our school.

1. OXFORD ONLINE PLACEMENT TEST SPECIFICATIONS

- 1. The Oxford Online Placement Test is a computer-adaptive test of English for non-native speakers of English, delivered on demand, and reports results at levels Pre-A1, A1, A2, B1, B2, C1, and C2 of the Common European Framework of Reference (CEFR). This test was developed by Oxford University Press (OUP) to allow institutions to quickly and reliably place their English language learners in the correct level of English class. Placement testing is a fundamental stage of the learning cycle.

- 3. The online test lasts about 60 minutes.
- 4. The certificate you receive is valid for a lifetime.
- 5. You will need to take the exam in a session reserved for you in our university's language laboratories with the personal password and user information sent to you. Detailed announcements about the exam will be published in the "Announcements" section of our school before the exam.
- 6. The test has two parts: *Use of English* ve *Listening*, each has three parts and scores weigh differently.

OXFORD ONLINE PLACEMENT TEST RESULTS

1. Results are available instantly and reported both as a CEFR band (Pre-A1 to C2) and as a standardized score on the OPT scale (0-120). Our school evaluates them on a scale of 100. 2. SCHOOL OF FOREIGN LANGUAGES PLACEMENT TEST

- 1. This exam measures your English level in our school's starting groups: A1 (Beginner), A2 (Elementary), B1 (Pre-intermediate), and B1+ (Intermediate).
- 2. The School Placement Test consists of a total of 55 questions.
- **3.** The exam duration is 60 minutes. It is conducted face-to-face.
- **4.** The weight of each question varies according to the level. The weighting is provided at the beginning of each section.
- 5. The test has two parts: *Use of Language* and *Reading*.
